2025 Transatlantic Schools Exchange Dinner

On April 5, 30 Old Blues, FCH Board members, friends and representatives from Gilman and Bryn Mawr schools celebrated the 19th annual exchange program between the two Baltimore schools and CH. Each year a CH boy spends time at Gilman and a CH girl at Bryn Mawr, to stay with exchange partner families and experience US culture. The American students then experience boarding life at CH.

The schools exchange has a long history. A regular attendee at the event is Ken McDonald (CH 50-51) who spent an exchange year at CH 75 years ago. Nik Feldman (MaA 09-09) who was a Gilman exchange scholar in 2009, is now an FCH Board member and hosted the memorable Founder's Day Dinner in Lexington last year.



This year's CH students were Arabella and Kamsi (pictured left with their exchange partners Michael and Kate). Arabella is studying A levels in biology, chemistry, and German. She is involved in community service, the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme and the Medical Society. Kamsi is taking A levels in maths, further maths, physics and a one-year course in computer science. He is also in the Corps of Drums, Senior Band and Dixieland Band and in the 1st XI for football and 1st XV for rugby.

Both Arabella and Kamsi spoke to the group after dinner. Here are excerpts from their addresses..

Kamsi - "One of the most enriching aspects of this exchange has been the personal growth that comes from embracing change. It's a delightful challenge that has made each day memorable. This exchange has broadened my perspective on education, friendship, and family in ways I hadn't imagined"

Arabella - "I joined CH as a Deputy Grecian 7 months ago and find myself having new experiences every day. The atmosphere of the school produces people who want to do well academically and be the best version of themself. Most people are interested in achieving in their chosen sports, with many playing at the county level. At Bryn Mawr, sport is played even more regularly than at CH. The varsity softball team practices after school every day for 2 hours and I have already attended 2 games, even though I have only been in Baltimore for a week. I am eternally grateful for this opportunity as it has given me a chance to learn about other cultures."




2024 FCH Survey Results




What's the best way to get information to you?



Are you interested in regional get-togethers with other Old Blues in your area?




Are you happy to share your contact information between CH and FCH?

Update on the FCH-sponsored Blue Fund Presentees

There are currently two FCH-sponsored Blue Fund students at CH. Each fully supported for a 7-year education by the generosity of US Old Blues.

Ariadne, UF, is doing well academically, especially in chemistry, German, maths, physics, and theology & philosophy. She recently participated in the school's production of Les Miserables, is a committed member of the Community Action team and continues to focus on improving her swimming ability.

Rhys, Second Form, has made a promising start to his time at CH. He has already shown potential in geography, maths, Latin, history, and theology & philosophy. Outside academics, he has demonstrated his natural footballing ability and has taken very quickly to playing the trumpet.

21 Futures Campaign - update from Hugo Middlemas, CH Director of Development

CH has launched an urgent appeal—21 Futures—to protect 21 life-changing bursary places at Christ's Hospital.

Recent UK legislative changes mean CH is no longer eligible for Business Rates charitable relief and has seen a rise in employer national insurance contributions resulting in a £1million increase in annual costs. That's the equivalent of 21 full bursary places.

Every year, bursaries transform lives at CH. But now, CH risks having to reduce the number of places available to those who need them most. That's why we've launched 21 Futures—to protect these opportunities through increased support of our Blue Fund Bursaries and Donation Governorships.

Chairman's Corner

Now, more than ever, Friends of Christ's Hospital is focused on building the network of Old Blues in the USA. Thanks to your responses to the survey at the end of last year, we understand your interest in being engaged in Old Blue events. Whenever FCH runs an event (e.g. the Embassy reception in 2023, the Transatlantic Schools Exchange Dinner in Baltimore every April, Founder's Day Dinner in Lexington, KY, last October) we hear similar themes from attending Old Blues – how much you enjoy meeting up with other Old Blues and that you would like to do it more often if events were closer to home.

For these reasons, we are working to establish more local groups of Old Blues who live close enough to each other that they can reasonably easily get together from time-to-time on an informal basis - or to celebrate CH anniversaries, such as Founder's Day or St Matthew's Day.

In that context, we are looking to add some FCH Board members, or informal volunteers, to extend our reach into areas where we know there are concentrations of Old Blues. We are particularly interested to add Board members or informal volunteers in California (both in the Bay Area and Southern California), in the Carolinas and in New England ... but we would also welcome interest from any part of the United States.


Remembering Richard Dixon

Treasurer's Report - Fiscal Year 2024 (by Keith Worker)

FCH provides Old Blues and others residing in the US a tax-efficient way to support Christ's Hospital. As a tax-exempt public charity under sections 501 (c) 3 and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi) of the Internal Revenue Code, all donations to FCH are tax-deductible to the extent provided by law.

Income from donations in 2024 was \$142,712 (vs \$231,960 in 2023).

In 2024 there were 41 individual donors (vs 41 in 2023). These included significant donations from Anthony Furnivall, George Matcham and Trevor Tomkins.

Disbursements to Christ's Hospital in 2024 totaled \$148,122 (vs \$445,643 in 2023)

FCH's account balances on January 1, 2024 amounted to \$142,712. The closing account balances on December 31, 2024 totaled \$100,072.

Expenses were \$4,647 (vs \$5,080 in 2023). Expenses as a % of Income continued to be low (3.6%).

As required under US law, while the Board of Directors will always consider the expressed preferences of its donors when making grant decisions, the Board must retain discretion and control over the use of all contributions it receives. FCH has very low operating costs and its volunteer Board directly contributes to the organization's operating expenses. Checks written and mailed to FCH in the latter half of December, although tax-deductible to the donor, may not clear until the following year. If these amounts are substantial the grants shown on our Federal Return (Form 990) may be less than the grants actually made from the donations received.
